My research uses **complementary social and evolutionary perspectives** in understanding how fundamental social motives shape social perceptions and interpersonal preferences. This work primarily considers (1) the tradeoffs people that invoke to **avoid disease and belong to groups**, (2) the prioritization of physical features and behavioral repertoires in shaping **preferences for short-term and long-term mates**, and (3) how inferences of men's **formidability inform stereotypes of personality and social functions to inform coalitional preferences**.
